At the time of writing much of the surrounding area of Worcester is covered with flood water and in other parts of the country people are dealing with homes and businesses which have been hit twice already this year. It is a devastating and difficult time for many. While my home is not at risk, I am unable to reach our parishes and I find myself forced to stop; to stop running around and instead to pause. A good preparation for Lent, which, by the time you read this, will be upon us, having begun on Ash Wednesday (26th February). It is the season in the Church which leads us to Good Friday and to Easter. It is traditionally a time of penitence and fasting and often those who want to shed a pound or two choose the discipline of giving up chocolate or biscuits or cake, or even all three for the 6 week period. Others will often select a Lenten book to read during this season or will go on retreat for a few days to focus on God and Jesus, learning more about them and deepening their relationship with them.

I find it interesting that the word Lent itself means Spring. It points to the shoots and growth of new life which appear in our gardens and by the roadsides as we move towards the end of winter. It encourages us to look and to see beyond the darkness and despair in the world, in the difficult times we face, and to go forward with hope, remembering that although Jesus's Lenten journey to Jerusalem took him to his death on the Cross, he rose from the 'cold-stone tomb' on that glorious first Easter Day. He lives always in our hearts and continues to be the source of light in the darkness, the bringer of new life. So I pray that we may all find time to pause and, as we see the shoots and buds appear in gardens all around, reflect, and draw closer to him that he may fill us with the hope and peace of new life in him.

Into the dark world a snowdrop comes,
a blessing of hope and peace
carrying within it a green heart:
symbol of God's renewing love.
Come to inhabit our darkness, Lord Christ,
for dark and light are alike to you.
May nature's white candles of hope
remind us of your birth and lighten our journey

#### **Broadwas and Cotheridge Community Fibre Partnership**

The Parish Council is working with Worcestershire Council's Superfast Broadband Team and BT Openreach to use the government funding to improve our internet connections, by replacing the copper connections that run from the local cabinets to homes and businesses.

Based on how different parts of the parish connect to cabinets, we are at different stages.

We have a cost from Openreach for the 27 addresses in Little Green, which means that each address will shortly get a letter and a form. Hopefully as the success of the scheme depends on as many people as possible signing up, by the 5th of March everyone will have made their decision. For each sign up we can get a government voucher, and as long as the total value equals the cost of instillation we will be able to place the order, and within 12 months people will be able to take up the better service.

We will soon get the costs for the main areas of Broadwas and Cotheridge and then be able to ask people to sign up.

When you get your letter please look at it carefully and if you have further questions please visit the Parish Council website <a href="https://www.broadwas-cotheridge.com">https://www.broadwas-cotheridge.com</a> and look for the page Community Fibre Partnership.

We have learnt that the government fund is running low so timing is now crucial. Although a fibre connection and the faster speeds it brings may not be a priority for everyone, for many homes and businesses in the parish this also addresses the very slow speeds and poor connections they experience.
