Hopefully by the time you read this the weather will have improved somewhat (having written this during our wet June) and we can look around and see the beauty of the creation in which we live.

Having said that of course we do need rain to water and feed creation. Not only do the plants need it but so do we.

During the last few months we have also been challenged about how we care for that creation. We have seen people demonstrating quite forcefully in London to bring to our attention and our governments and world leaders attention the plight which our planet faces if we continue to abuse it in the way that we do.

Yet that is not the case of course.

Living together is not only a scientific issue but a political one and I dare to mention the word Brexit - it does make me ask questions. As a Christian we are called to live together in peace and harmony, but our country is certainly not at one at the moment.

Have we anything to learn from scripture? Does our faith teach us anything? I think it does. For when our relationship with God is right, then our relationship with his earth is right and our relationship with one another is right.

I leave you with this food for thought knowing that some will disagree with me but at least it makes us think.
