Cotheridge Church Tower

The tower has, in the past, been dated "loosely" to the 15th century. This has now been tightened to the 2nd quarter of the 15th century, more precisely to 1430. A small team from Nottingham have spent a couple of days drilling core samples from the main structural timbers in the lower and upper sections of the tower, which appeared to have been built at separate times. However the tree ring analysis has shown that the trees used to have been cut down in the

same season. In fact so close were patterns that several of the timbers could have come from the same tree! Now we have to do some more analysis into the constructional techniques to try to discover why the top section appears to be different. The story goes on!- the joy of being interested in history - there's always more to be discovered.

Martin Lewis the Money Saving Expert (no relation), Community First, Boiler Juice and Oil Club etc., but I wondered if you know I have been doing just this since 1976 for a group of friends, neighbours and colleagues in Broadwas, Cotheridge, Knightwick, Cradley, Wichenford and Broadheath.

Prompted by a colleague who knew a manager of Butlers Oil and the penalty I was paying for having a small oil tank, I was never able to order over 1000 litres to get the best price. Now, by buying in even greater quantities we can enjoy even better prices.

Our group is sadly reducing in size by bereavement and folks moving away so my ability to negotiate prices for a full tanker of 23,000 litres is getting difficult.

If anyone is interested in joining our group please mail me and I will give you more details. There is no commitment and you can always cancel after I place an order if you didn't like the deal. I usually order 2 - 3 times per year in bulk and anticipate the next one to be January / February.
